Cross-cutting measures

Implement the UNECE Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment. The application of strategic environmental assessment significantly contributes to the development of sectoral energy plans and programmes, as well as policies and legislation, that assist countries in meeting their renewable energy targets and enhance international cooperation.

Implement also the UNECE Aarhus Convention (Convention on Access to Information, Public Participation in Decision-making and Access to Justice in Environmental Matters) and its Protocol on Pollutant Release and Transfer Registers to strengthen capacities of authorities to promote effective access to environmental information and to engage effectively NGOs, local communities and other stakeholders with respect to energy issues. Make use of tools and materials developed by the Aarhus Convention and its Protocol.
