

TRAVEL INFORMATION

Copenhagen Airport is located about 13 kms (a 15 minute train trip) from Copenhagen Central Station.

The railway station at the airport is located under terminal 3. Tickets are available from the DSB ticket office above the railway station in Terminal 3. Tickets and travel cards (for the Copenhagen and Northern Zealand HT-zone) are also available from ticket machines in the station area. The trip from the airport to central Copenhagen and to the hotel costs 27 DKK. A taxi from the airport to central Copenhagen costs about 150 - 180 DKK. Credit cards are accepted.

If going by public transportation from the airport to the hotel take the airport train direction Copenhagen or Elsinore to Ørestaden St (one stop). From there take the metro-train to Kongens Nytorv St. and walk the last half a kilometer (see walking route on the map).



Transportation in the city

To get around in Copenhagen it is possible to use buses, metro, trains and taxis as well as free city bikes which are parked all over the city.

Each trip with public transport costs 18-27 DKK depending on the length of the trip but it is possible to buy different types of reduced priced tickets. A card for 10 trips in central Copenhagen costs 115 DKK (2 zones) but to be able to go to and from the airport it will be 155 DKK (3 zones). It is also possible to buy 24 hour free ride cards for 105 DKK or special city passes that also include free entrance to a lot of museums and events for 199 DKK/27 Euro (one day) and 429 DKK/58 Euro (three days). MONEY

The Danish currency is the krone (DKK) which is divided into 100 øre (oere). Banks are usually open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m, Monday to Friday. Credit cards are accepted in numerous stores, boutiques, restaurants etc.
