II. ANNOTATIONS TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

Item 1. Introduction

<u>Documentation</u>: ECE/TRANS/WP.5/42, ECE/EX/2008/L.5

1. At its twentieth session (Geneva, 13-14 September 2007), the UNECE Working Party on Transport Trends and Economics (WP.5) decided to propose to the Inland Transport Committee (ITC) to assign the monitoring and co-ordinating responsibility of work related to the Euro-Asian Transport Links (EATL) initiative to an expert group (ECE/TRANS/WP.5/42, p. 4, paragraph 10). At its seventieth session (Geneva, 19-21 February 2008), the ITC agreed to establish the proposed Group of Experts on Euro-Asian Transport Links and adopted its terms of reference (ECE/TRANS/200, paragraph 29 and annex III). Subsequently, the UNECE Executive Committee has approved the establishment of the Group of Experts on Euro-Asian Transport Links (ECE/EX/2008/L.5).

Item 2. Election of officers

2. The Group of Experts will appoint its officers: a Chairperson, and if deemed necessary, one or two Vice-Chairpersons.

4. The Group will be informed by the secretariat about the main achievements of the EATL project in the period 2002-2007. The UNECE-UNESCAP in-house study (http://www.unece.org/trans/MinisterialITC70/min_jointstatement.htm) and a copy of the Joint Statement of Ministers of Transport (http://www.unece.org/trans/MinisterialITC70/min_study.htm) will be made available. Background information concerning Phase I of the UNECE-UNESCAP EATL project can be found in document ECE/TRANS/WP.5/2007/2.

Item 5. Review of initiatives by international organizations and consideration of possible synergies with the EATL Phase II

5. International organizations such as the EU TRACECA, CAREC, BSEC, OSCE, IRU and UIC will provide information concerning their own transport-related activities in the Euro-Asian region and possible synergies with the EATL Phase II.

6. The UNECE and UNESCAP secretariats will present a plan for continuation of the EATL project (Phase II).

- 7. The Expert Group may wish to discuss its programme of work, objectives, tasks and deliverables as well as funding issues and its terms of reference, which include a number of elements:
 - (a) continuation of Phase II of the EATL and fulfilling the recommendations of the ECE/ESCAP Joint Study on Developing Euro-Asian Transport Linkages.
 - (b) establishment and maintenance of an inventory of initiatives, activities and projects related to the development of Euro-Asian transport links as well as completing and updating the EATL database on priority infrastructure investments.
 - (c) implementation of identified priority projects and promotion of the inclusion of all identified EATL routes in the respective international network agreements.
 - (d) addressing the obstacles to smooth movement of goods across international borders.

- (e) strengthening the capacity of national officials from various agencies dealing with border-crossing formalities and procedures.
- (f) accession to and effective implementation of UNECE, UNESCAP and other international legal instruments relating to transport facilitation.
