
# Proposal for Supplement 7 to UN Regulation No. 129 (Enhanced Child Restraint Systems)

The modifications to the current text of the UN Regulation No. 129 are marked in strikethrough for deleted characters.

# I. Proposal

Paragraph 8.1., amend to read:

- "8.1. The test report shall record the results of all tests and measurements including the following test data:
  - (a) The type of device used for the test (acceleration or deceleration device);

• • •

(i) The following dummy criteria: HPC, Head acceleration Cum3 ms, Upper neck tension force, Upper neck moment, Chest acceleration Cum3 ms Chest deflection Abdominal Pressure (in frontal impact)."

# II. Justification

Chest deflection and abdominal pressure are injury requirements that were not required in the original version of the UN Regulation.
